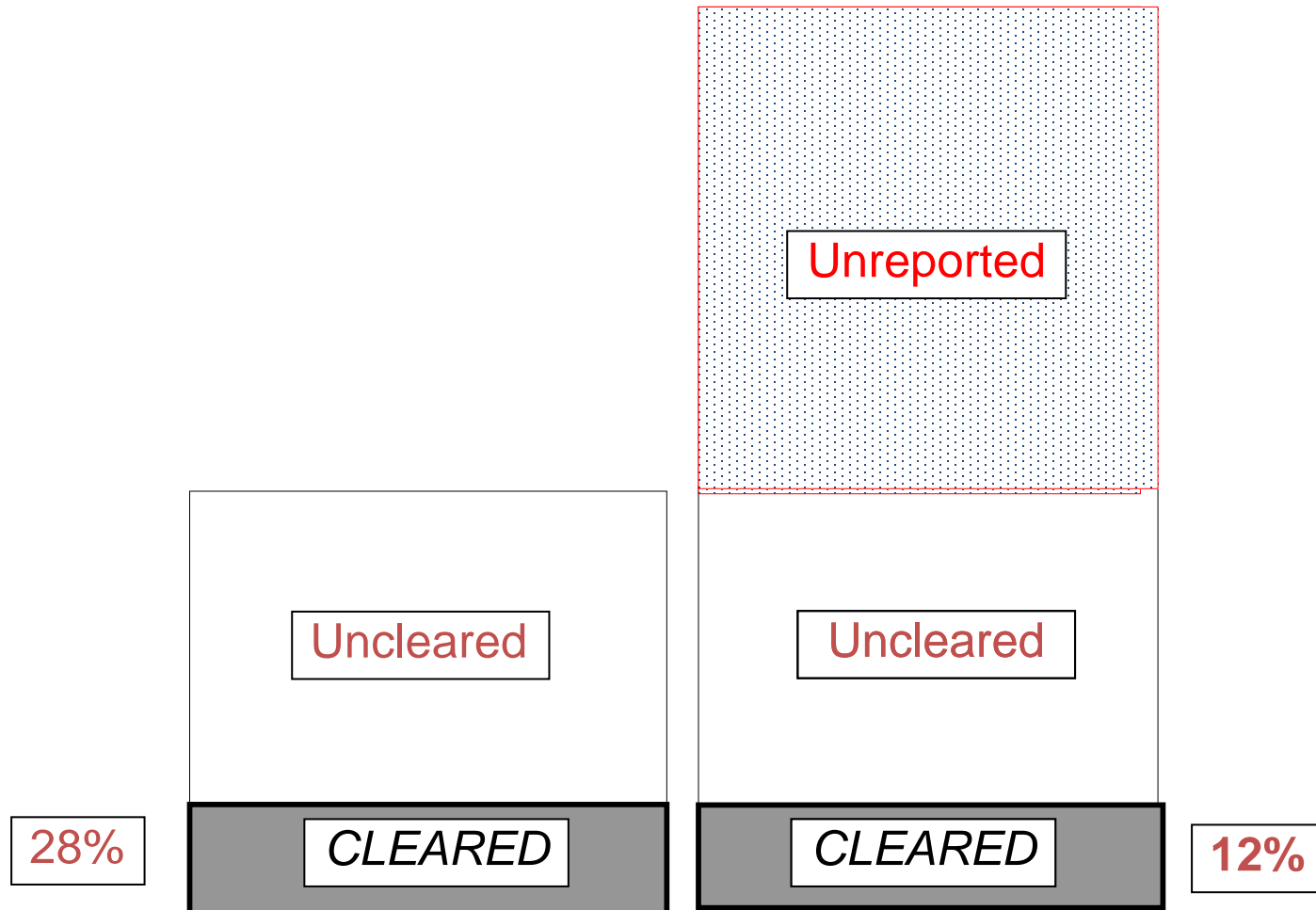
Definition of Neighborhood Policing

- Neighborhood policing is calls for delivering police service through teams of officers assigned to geographic areas within the city for which they are accountable.
- It involves police and community partners working together to identify and work on crime and order maintenance problems.
- Neighborhood policing teams, deployed at the right places and in the right numbers help create neighborhoods that are safe and feel safe.

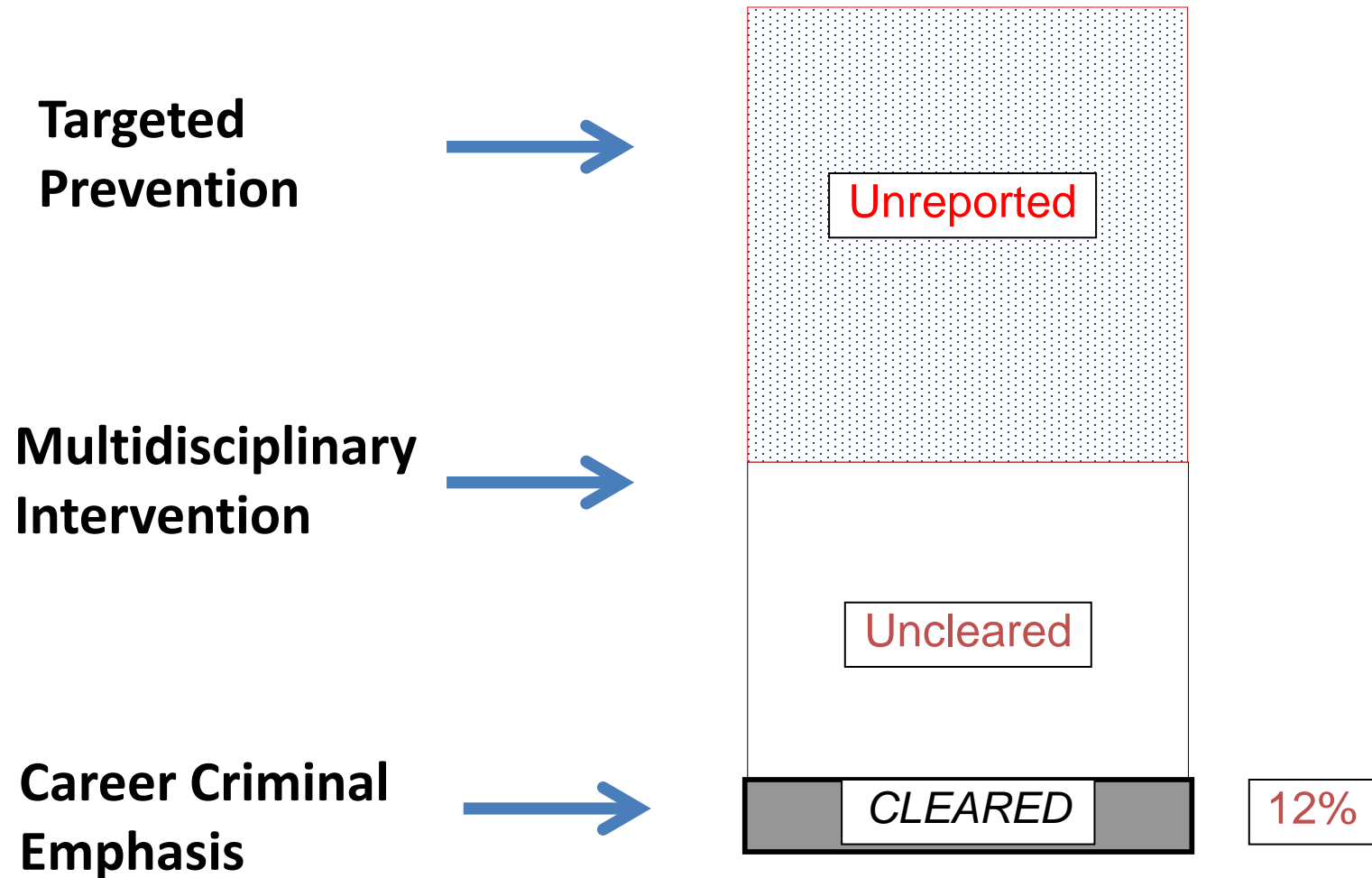
Implementation of Neighborhood Policing

- All Department staff participate.
- Accountability for addressing problems is fixed.
- Generalist personnel deal with a wide variety of problems.
- Prevention, intervention, and enforcement strategies are blended as needed.
- Emphasis is placed on victims, repeat offenders, and the circumstances that bring them together.
- Improves patrol officer job satisfaction, community support and neighborhood safety.

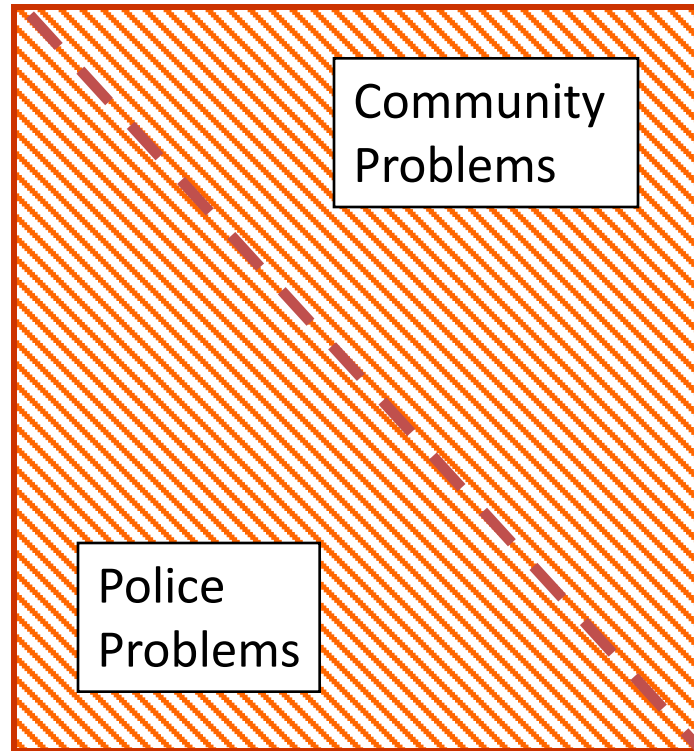
Reported and Unreported Crime



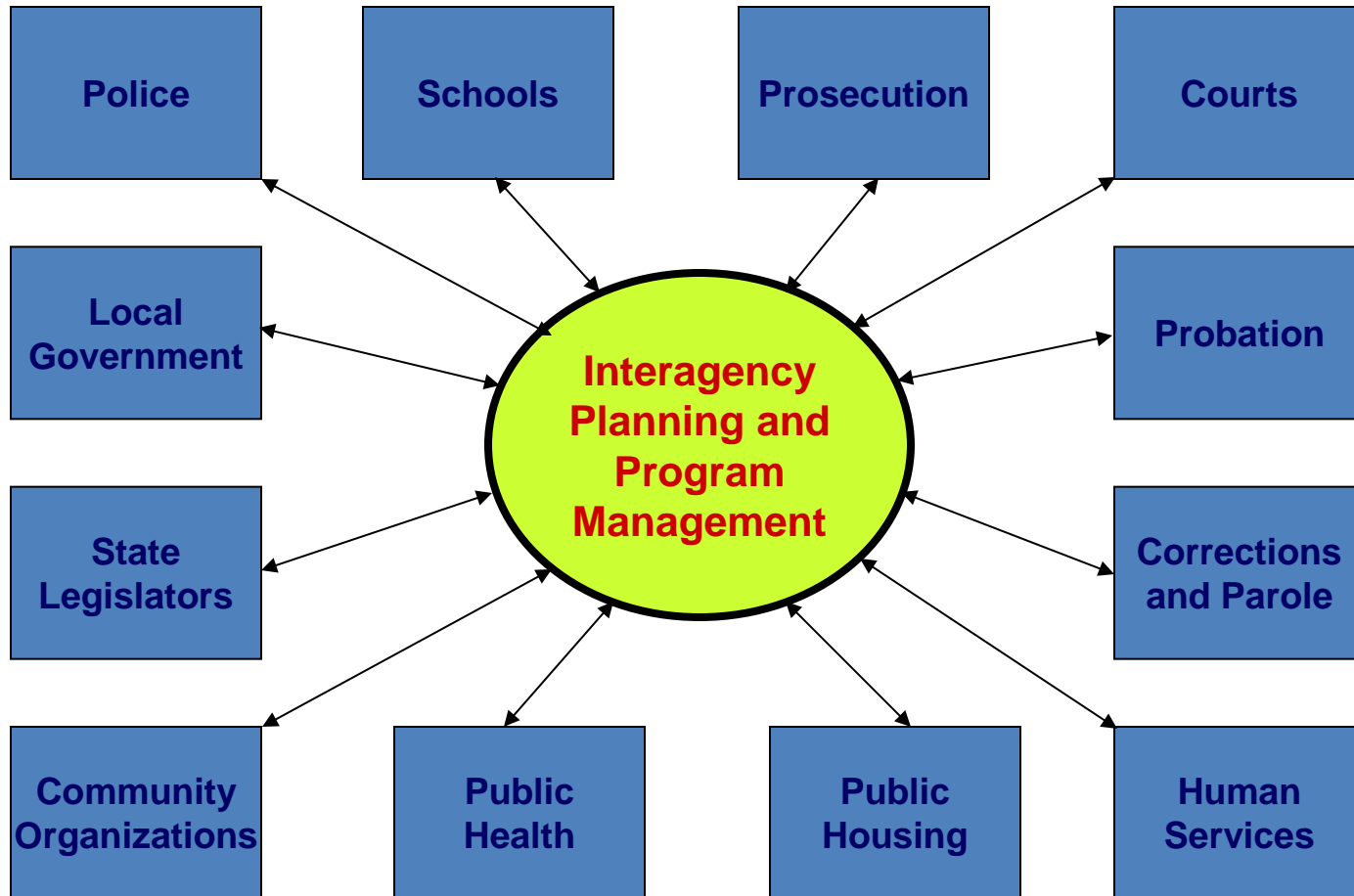
Comprehensive Approach to Crime Problems



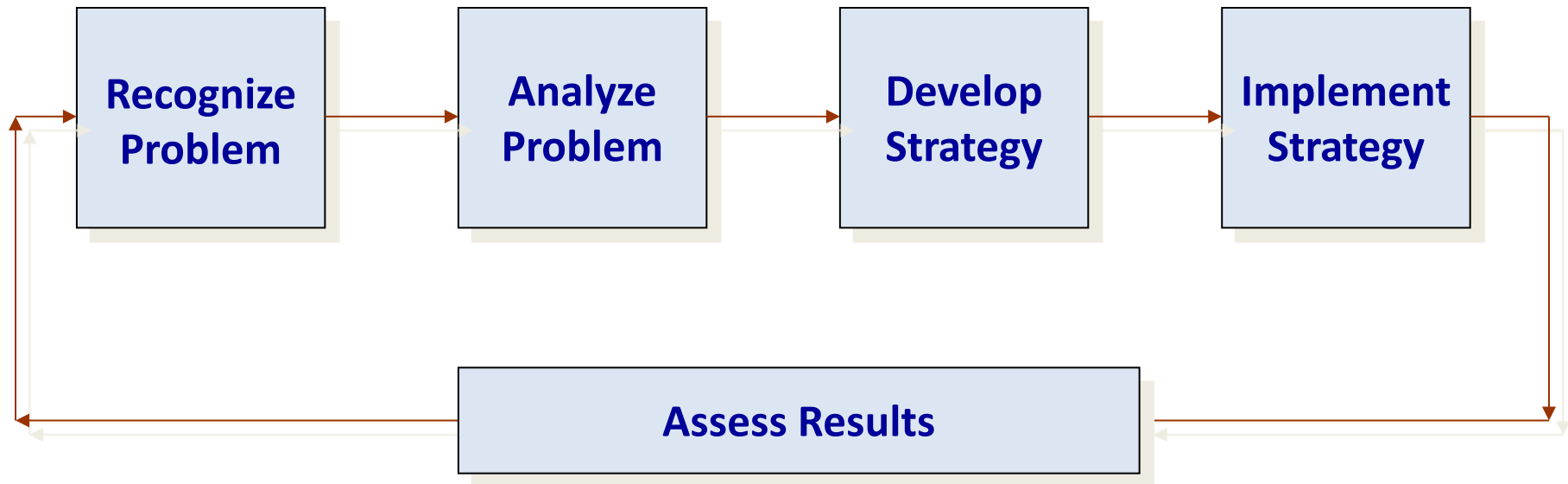
Police-Community Division of Labor



Interagency Collaboration for NP



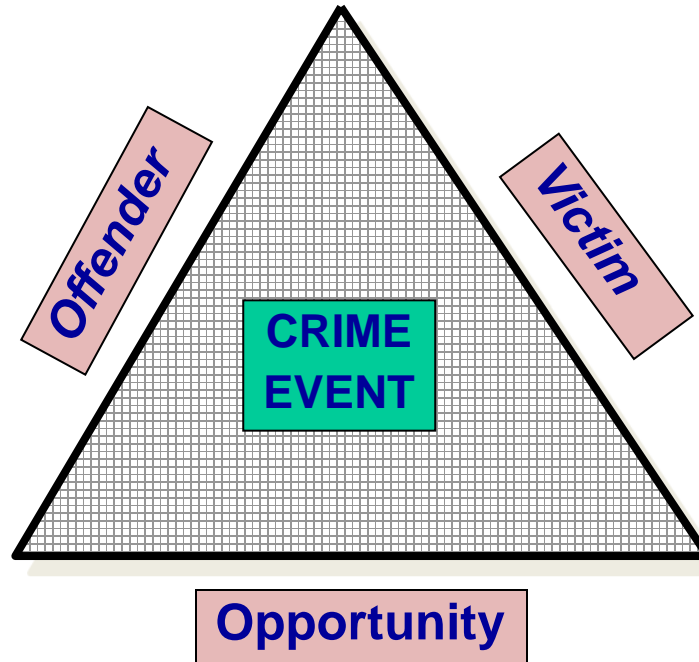
The Problem Solving Process



Definition of A Problem

An incident or number of repeated incidents that typically occur at the same location, involve the same people, and are of concern to the public and the police.

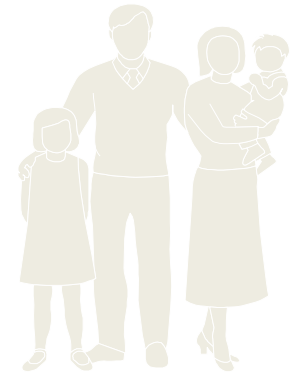
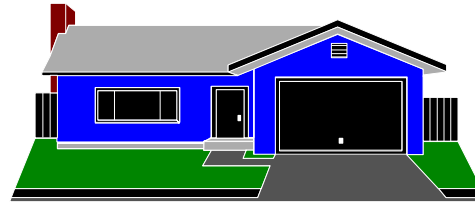

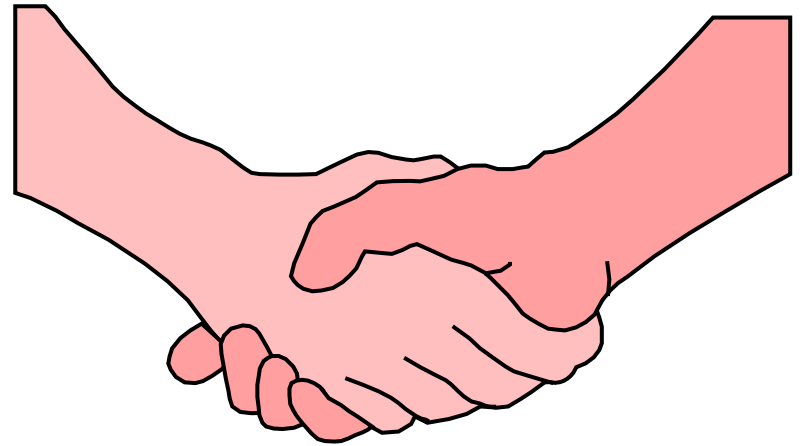
Linkage With Neighborhood Organizations

Implementation of Neighborhood Policing

- Staff patrol with enough officers to create adequate proactive time.
- Efficiently manage calls for service to reduce non-emergency dispatches.
- Develop patrol areas to which teams of officers will be assigned.
- Establish a leadership structure for teams and shifts.
- Provide adequate information and training for patrol officers assigned to team areas.
- Address crime and order maintenance problems at the team area as much as possible
