

Portal Educational Services are:

### Comprehensive Skills Assessment

Students have the opportunity to complete the WorkKeys® national work-force development assessment and the COMPASS® college placement test to support their educational goals.

### Career Blueprinting

Participants will work with their Career Pathway Coach to complete the career blueprint, a customized career and academic plan.

### Digital Literacy

Participants are introduced to the Windows® operating system, Microsoft Word®, and the Internet. Through a series of online lessons, students develop the digital literacy skills most desired by today's employers.

### STEM Readiness

The STEM Readiness course is tailored to fit the participant's career pathway in the health science, life science, information technology or engineering technology disciplines.

### Adult Learning Academy

This innovative self-paced course, contextualized to the STEM career pathways, enhances student success as individuals improve their skills in English, math and/or reading.
