A special meeting of the Ferguson City Council was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on July 13, 2004, by Mayor Steven Wegert, in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 110 Church Street, Ferguson, Missouri. On roll call the following Council members were present:

## **NEW BUSINESS – Neighborhood Agenda**

City Manager, A. J. Krieger discussed the formulation and adoption of neighborhood goals. Administration hopes that the Council will establish and adopt a set of goals based on affirmative statements regarding its vision for Ferguson neighborhoods. Staff anticipates completing, implementing and monitoring a neighborhood improvement plan designed to stimulate demand and increase the general livability of, and quality of life in, Ferguson neighborhoods. A lengthy discussion ensued. Mayor indicated that Staff has heard what the Council has said and the Council agrees that the neighborhood agenda points, as presented, represent the Council's goals for neighborhoods. And as such, Council will focus on four neighborhood goals: 1) Establish a community-wide network of neighborhood organizations; 2) Stimulate demand through a concerted neighborhood planning effort to help each neighborhood design its ideal living environment; 3) Target infrastructure and pedestrian improvements to increase livability; and 4) Maintain high community standards by providing quality inspection and code enforcement services. The City will, proactively in cooperation with the leaders of individual neighborhoods, prioritize their needs, establish actions and address them.

A.J. informally introduced the new Planning & Development Director, Jennifer Denton to Council and will formally introduce her at a future Council meeting.

A.J. discussed the Sales Tax Increase issue and handed out previous propositions for Council's review. In order to place the tax issue on the November ballot the City needs to have two readings prior to the August 24<sup>th</sup> deadline. Staff will prepare the Ordinance for first reading at the July 27<sup>th</sup> Council meeting.
